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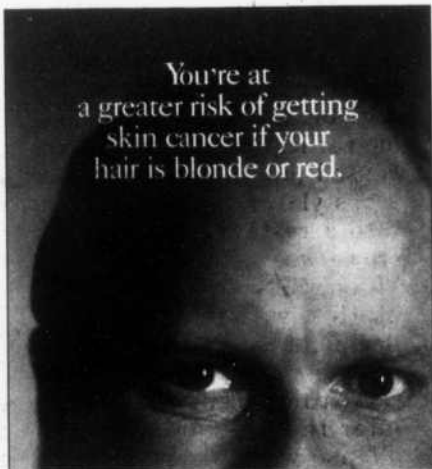

Hostelling near major ski resorts

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In the Midwest go cross-country skiing out of the hostel's back door in Itasca State Park, Minnesota, and the Cuyahoga Valley National Recreation Area in Ohio.

Pennsylvania boasts eight hostels near ski areas—several in state parks—including the Pocono Mountains. Overnight fees range from just \$8 to \$15. In Tennessee, ski the Ober

Gatlinburg Ski Area and stay at HI-Great Smoky Mountains for just \$14.

In New England, you can ski the top places in Connecticut, Vermont, New Hampshire and Massachusetts for just \$10 to \$17 a night for your accommodations.

HI White Mountain Hostel in Conway, New Hampshire, includes linen and a continental breakfast in the low \$16 overnight fee. Vermont hostels are near Killington, Stratton Mountain, Middlebury College Snow Bowl and Suicide Six Ski Areas.

HI-AYH hostels provide affordable dormitory-style lodging for travelers of all ages. Separate accommodations are provided for males and females. Many hostels have private couple and family reservations.

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Hostelling International-American Youth Hostels is a

nonprofit organization and a member of the International Youth Hostel Federation (IYHF). With nearly 5,000 hostels in more than 70 countries, the IYHF is the largest network of accommodations in the world.

Revealing Thoughts From Playboy's Girls Of The ACC

Playboy bunnies are popping up on college campuses throughout the nation, but students may not realize a few of their classmates - wearing far less makeup and far more clothing, of course - are among them.

This month, more than 40 women from Atlantic Coast Conference colleges - Clemson, Duke, Florida State, Georgia Tech, Maryland, North Carolina State, UNC-Chapel Hill, Virginia and Wake Forest - are posing in what the folks at Playboy say is one of the most popular editions of the men's magazine.

The women - deemed by Playboy to be "the pride of the eastern seaboard" - auditioned for the spread amid angry protests from students insisting that the magazine degrades women and contributes to a variety of societal ills, including sexual abuse and harassment. The criticism was so bothersome that some of the women - including two UNC-Chapel Hill students - withdrew their personal contact information from school phone and e-mail directories and Web sites.

Why would anyone want to subject themselves to such hassles?

"My whole life, I've wanted my 15 minutes of fame; I've craved it," Chapel Hill senior Summer Jehs, one of this year's six Tar Heel models, told *The Daily Tar Heel*. "And the older I got, I didn't only want mine, I wanted 100,000 other people's. I want to be the next Uma Thurman, and this goes along with it."

"You know," continued Jehs, who slathered baby oil all over her body for a steamy shower pose, "a lot of other people in Hollywood started out either in Playboy or doing a topless or nude scene in their first movie. This is a good place to start."

Aside from the autographing sessions that happened after the magazine hit store shelves and the flurry of mail they received from adoring fans, some of the Chapel Hill students who posed say their lives - including their dating lives - haven't changed very much.

"I get recognized more than I thought I would," said Kim Ziegler, a journalism major who graduated from UNC in May. "It's strange to be walking down the street and have people go, 'Hey, that's Kim Ziegler.'"

"I've gotten some fan mail," she continued. "I've also gotten some phone calls; they want me to take more pictures. But nobody's come after me and said, 'Oh, you shouldn't have done that.'"

Second looks from students on campus and affirmation from family and friends are just about all sophomore journalism major Brandee Potts - who auditioned for the article on a dare from her boyfriend - said she's gotten from the experience.

"No one really recognizes me," said Potts, who appears topless next to an antique airplane. "The picture

really doesn't look like me in the face. They put on so much makeup."

While some of the models, like Potts, said they have received nothing but support and praise for their foray into modeling, they do concede to having had some nagging, negative feelings.

"It doesn't bother me that (guys on campus) have seen me naked," Potts told the *Tar Heel*. "It bothers me that that's the only part of me that they know because I hold my personality to be (more important) than my looks."

Ziegler admitted that she had to deal with her mother - who made it clear she wasn't pleased with Ziegler's decision to pose.

"My mom is pretty old-fashioned so she was a little concerned," Ziegler said. "It's just that she has misconceptions about (Playboy). She feels it's pornography. She lumps it in with Hustler and stuff. But it's really not."

UNC sophomore journalism major Kathleen Hancock said she dodged

family confrontation by waiting until a day after the Playboy shoot to tell her parents what she'd done.

"I don't think that there is anything wrong with Playboy magazine and the content of its photography," Hancock wrote on her personal Web site - which also states that she subscribes to the magazine with hopes of editing it someday. "All the pictures are tastefully done, and it is any woman's right to pose nude if she wants..."

Most of the Tar Heel models said they were pleased with the professionalism with which Playboy employees treated them. The students said they were given a substantial amount of input when it came to the shoot itself - including how much, or little, clothing they would wear.

"I wanted my picture to be one of the most conservative in the magazine, and they respected that," Potts said.

While thrilling, the experience was also exhausting, the women agreed.

"I have a whole new respect for models," Hancock said. "It was 2 1/2 hours for hair and makeup alone."

Potts agreed.

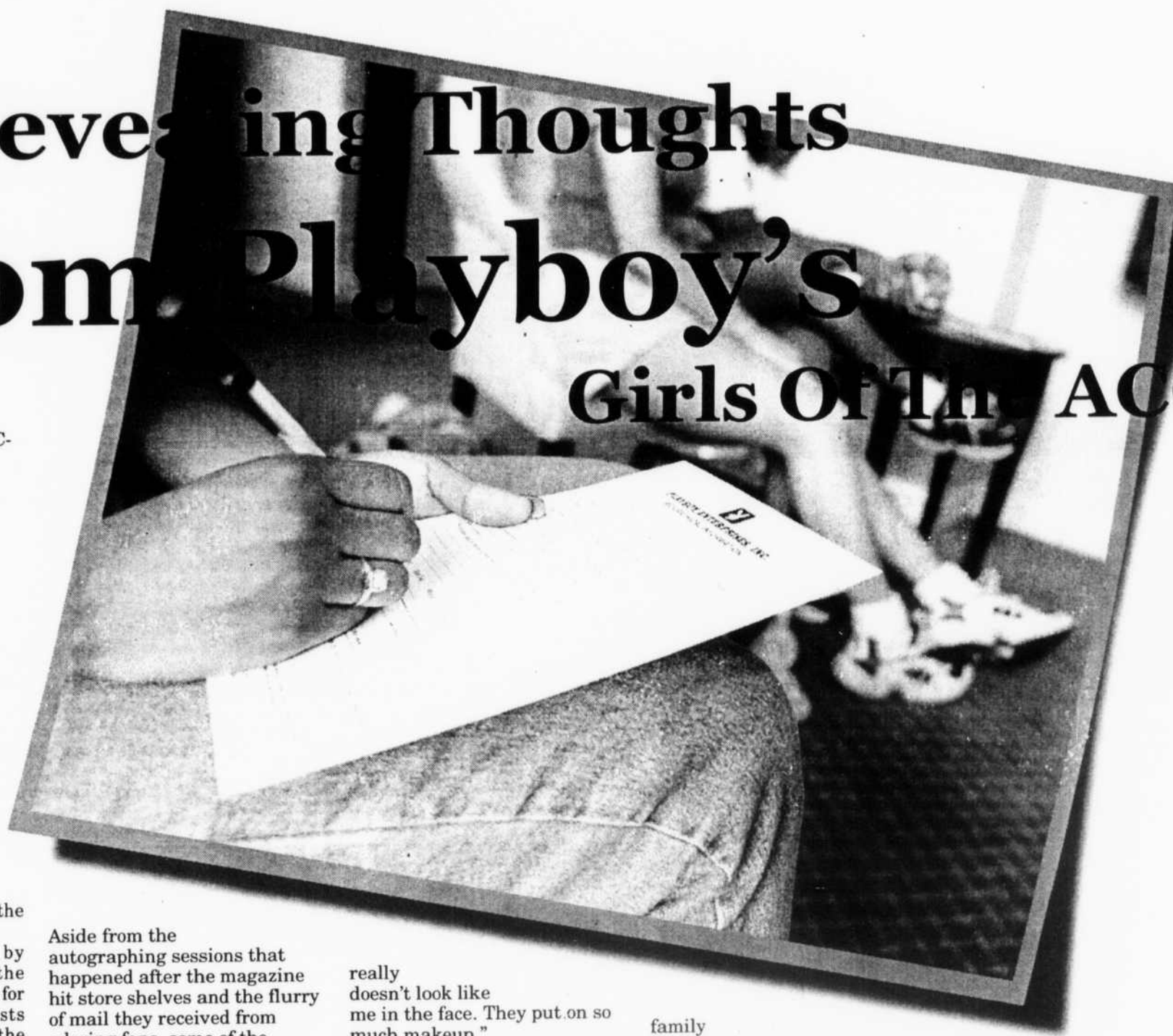
"You don't realize what all goes into it," she said. "It's really tiring because you're constantly smiling and posing."

But with all of that behind them, are they proud of the end result?

"I know that when I'm 40 years old I'm going to be able to look at that and remember the photo shoot, remember the signing, remember the other girls, remember everything about it," Jehs said. "And when I'm an old grandmother, I'm going to be like, 'Look, I used to be pretty.'"

A freshman looks at ...

College Sex

When asked to write an editorial regarding sex, I balked, believing that it occurred nightly and anyway, "who wants to read a freshman write about college sex? What does he know?"

Perhaps that mentality holds true, but I figured I'd give this assignment a shot anyway.

Hear me out. This editorial is how I, an 18-year-old college-going Joe, see college nightlife and how we - college students, that is - regard sex. Granted this is a biased view from a white suburbia-bred boy from the Reckies; I play golf, and my Mom sports a minivan. But at least my writing is open and honest.

So here goes.

Generally speaking, college students regard sex as play; nothing more, nothing less. We've adopted a permissive attitude and loose behavior that's running rampant throughout society.

Years back the media hounded several gangs in California when they discovered gang members kept track of the numbers the girls with whom they'd had sex. Frightening

yes, but I'll bet there's hardly a frat house in this nation that doesn't do the same thing - either officially or unofficially.

I hear frat boys at my school, Tulane University, keep track of such stats amid laughter and slaps on the back. It's a game, I tell you. Their exploits have garnered them a reputation for proclivity in the sack, and the blatant stories told of and by them are campus legends. They have to keep the myth - and the games - alive.

Don't think fraternity boys are the only ones guilty of this offense. They're actually no better or worse than non-Greek guys and - horror of horrors - women. We're all equals, in fact. I've seen the X's (a smiley face for the guy down the hall) on doors signaling, "Don't come in, I'm busy." Those doors open up to rooms inhabited by fraternity and sorority members, non-Greek men and women - even resident assistants.

We're growing up, but in a different world than our parents did. We expect our college classmates to have one-night stands. One girl I know gets pissed because her roommate is really loud when she's having sex on Friday

nights - not because it's with a different guy each week. Our parents would

consider our concept of sex socially repugnant. After all, we've turned sex into little more than a recreational activity.

Laugh if you want, but this behavior has more impact than hurt feelings and regrets: Safe sex on college campuses hovers only around 50%. One in four college students has a sexually transmitted disease. HIV, the virus that causes AIDS, is predicted to be the greatest killer of our generation.

And it's not only men who are making hushed trips to the doctor.

I was on a bus several weeks ago with a Tulane sorority that was inventing little sing-song rhymes about each of its rival sororities. In essence, those women belittled their rivals for not putting out, for having virgins in their ranks and for not pleasing boys. A guy sitting across the aisle from me couldn't help but smile when the girls praised themselves for "swallowing."

I smiled, too, but I felt hollow inside.

Many girls once held the belief that virginity was sacred and honored, but the percentage of those under 18 who have engaged in intercourse or other forms of sex has risen unabashedly since the '60s. Nowadays, the numbers approximate as such: Non virgin girls - 70%. Non-virgin males - 80%. And those numbers are still on the rise.

Former college "stud" turned

Christian author, John Gray, caught hold of a wave of loose girls during his school years and laments in his article "Romances with Wolves" that he slept with so many women. He's not upset because of religion or health issues as one might expect. No, Gray says he's upset because those women are now "married to other men."

"When I put myself in the shoes of those men, I wish that I hadn't done what I've done," he wrote. "In fact, I might even like to punch myself in the nose for it."

Chances are good that when Gray does marry, his wife will have the same regrets. Lots of women have been around the block - several times.

I've seen the male eyes track girls across the cafeteria - another little game with which we're all familiar. A friend once remarked when a blonde in a mini-skirt strode past that he "wouldn't mind getting

a piece of that." "She's a bitch," another friend countered. The first guy shot back, "It's not like I'd have to talk to her." Heads nodded; no explanation needed.

Even sexual assault, once a hideous crime both socially and legally, doesn't hold the weight it previously did. One survey of male college students reported that in 1984 almost 35 percent of respondents said they would rape a woman if they knew they wouldn't be caught. That number shot up to 50 percent this year.

A college counselor at another school told me a story about a girl who was raped on that campus several months ago. She went to a bar with friends, had maybe two beers and woke up naked next to a strange man. She was drugged no doubt, and left the office assuring the wide-eyed counselor that "she wouldn't drink for at least two or three weeks." The counselor told me no charges were pressed in the rape.

The young woman went out on a date the next Friday.

PORT CHARLES

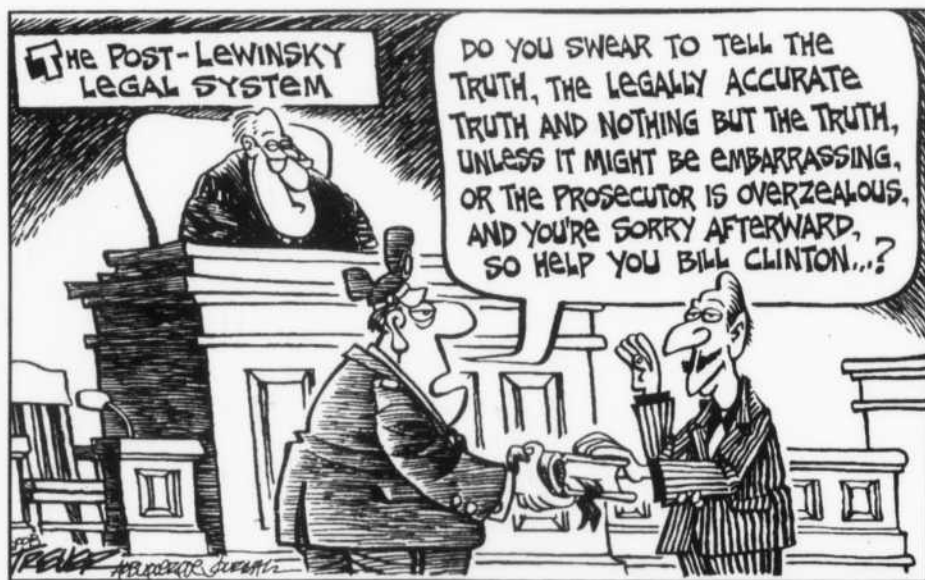

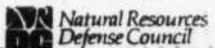

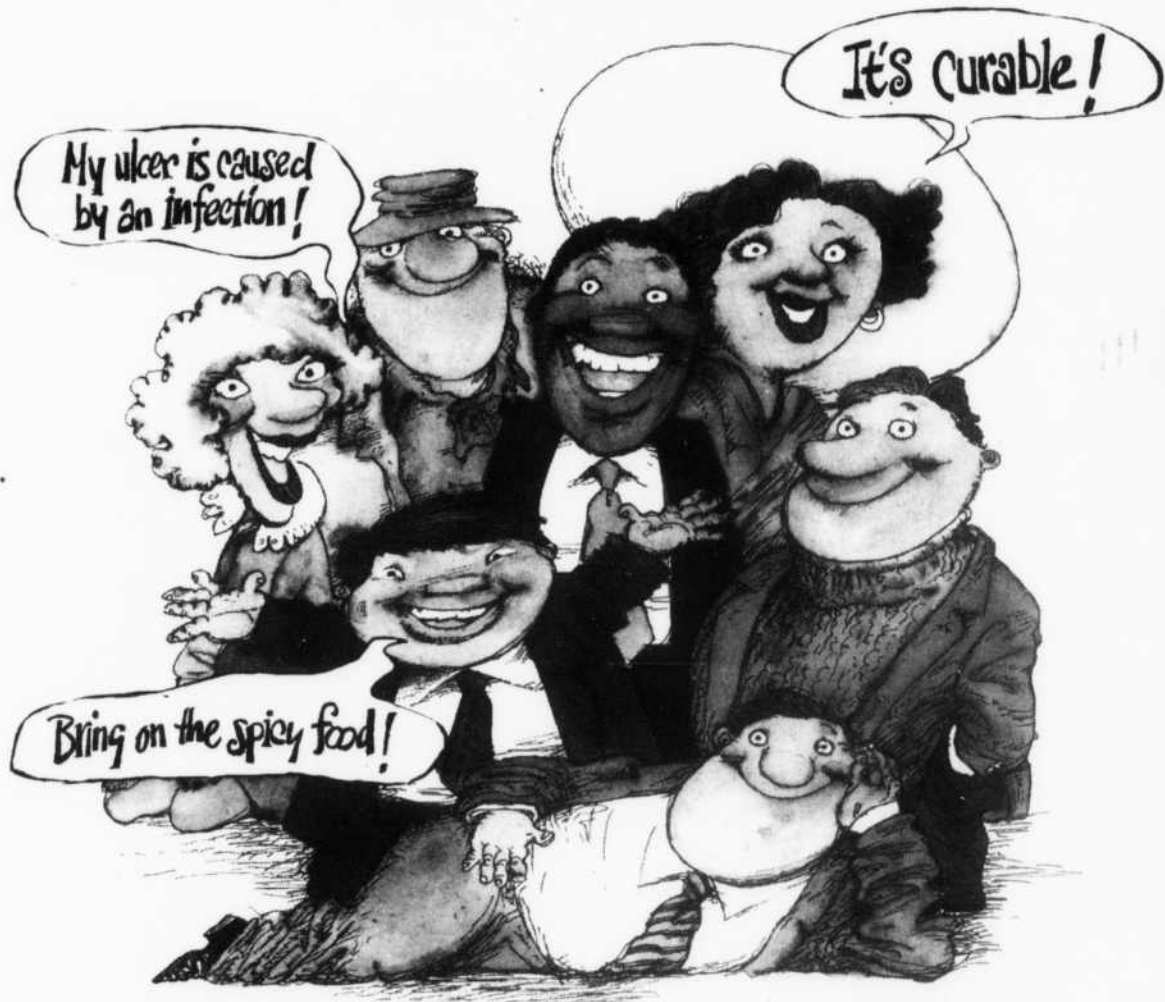
