A lesson in social graces

Students learn the manners of the business world

In the movie Pretty Woman, Julia Roberts had to quickly learn how to fit in the business world. Along with that she had to get a lesson in table manners from a hotel manager.

Outside of the "Reel World," most of us aren't lucky enough to get one-onone tutorials in social graces. But some students in the College of Business are getting just that.



At the time, Burton was at Florida State, and he said many of colleagues scuffed at the course.

Burton got his etiquette lessons when he attended a small liberal arts college where they had formal dinners each evening.

But he realized that most students don't have that opportunity. So he began to think about a seminar-style course, and after talking with Lee Moss, regional president for SunTrust Murfreesboro, they set it up.
