



Digital Scholarship Initiatives

Digital Scholarship is research enhanced by the design of digital projects, incorporation of digital tools and methodologies, collaboration among digital partners, and dissemination through digital platforms.

Digital Scholarship Lab at Walker Library

Serving as a hub for collaboration among campus centers, faculty, and students, the Digital Scholarship Lab creates and applies technologies that enhance digital initiatives. The products produced are often grant-funded, interdisciplinary, and strengthen the scholarly output of MTSU.

As the **digital publisher**, DSI is responsible for the management and accessibility of digital collections, web projects and publications.

All publications are digital and open access. Items receive baseline support: server space, basic web design, limited technical support, and the indexing, discoverability, and preservation of content. Content and platforms vary:



IEWLScholar@MTSU is the institutional repository (IR) of MTSU, a campus archive. Submit items digitally, including published articles, newsletters, conference proceedings, capstones, theses, and open educational resources.



Journals@MTSU uses Open Journal Systems (OJS) software to support open access publications created by MTSU affiliates that have a stable editorial team and publish regularly. OJS also offers an editorial management workflow. Journals are indexed by Worldcat, DOAI, Google, and other search engines.



Web / Digital Projects are typically grant-funded, and focus on digital scholarship, digital humanities (DH), and web applications that enhance the user experience.


Digital Collections

Digital Collections are created with and for scholars, including campus partners who value descriptive metadata records. Collections include both digitized and born-digital materials.

Digital Collections and Digital Projects often form collaborations among content scholars and technology experts that use digital methodologies (text mining, digitization, spatial analysis, digital preservation, usability), and digital tools (CONTENTdm, Scanners, ArcGIS, StoryMaps, Timeline S, Omeka, Drupal, Tableau, Voyant, Treejack, Chalkmark).
